



Are you willing to undergo a Garda clearance check?

Garda clearance checks are routine for employees of the health services. People acting on behalf of the National Ambulance Service will be in contact with vulnerable or at-risk people. The Gardaí will identify people with convictions for relevant offences only.

Do you hold a full driving license and have use of a car for your “On Call” periods?
